### 4.2 Christmas Concert Date and Set up

In the Board's debriefing in December of the previous Christmas Concert, we pointed out the problem with the lack of seating. Calvary requires a number keeping in mind we have 225 band members who would be sitting, throughout the other bands performances, listening. Set up for 700 required.

John Topic will ask the Concert Managers to follow up on the recommendation for Calvary the Wednesday before the concert

John has looked at the calendar for next year and determined that if we start the Fall Term on Wednesday, September 9, we can have the concert on Friday December 4. That would let us have a potluck on Wednesday, December 9. We would have 14 weeks in the Fall Term, just as we did this year. There would be no conflict with American Thanksgiving.
